


it wants a weekend off.

ne of the most memorable moments from our Cru training in Milwaukee was hearing Beth Guckenberger speak. A familiar voice at conferences, youth gatherings, and churches, Beth brings both passion and depth wherever she goes. She's the author of twelve books, serves with an international orphan care ministry, and sits on the Board of Directors for Cru. Together with her husband, Todd, they've raised eleven children—a beautiful blend of biological, foster, and adopted—reflecting the heart of their calling.

In Milwaukee, Beth Guckenberger introduced us to one of her many children's books. She shared her deep commitment to engaging the next generation with the truth of who God is. One of the most frequent questions she's asked is, "When is it too early to talk to children about evil? We don't want to scare them." Her response is both honest and disarming: "Disney has already taught them about evil!" She reminded us that children are the low-hanging fruit on the tree—ready and eager to learn. We must begin early, teaching them how to stand strong in their faith.

Beth went on to read her latest book, The Heart Who Wanted to Be Whole. Written for ages 4 to 8, the story follows a heart that's been hurt and longs to be healed. After trying to fix itself and

listening to the wrong voices, the heart finally turns to the One who speaks truth—the Maker of heaven and earth. Through vibrant illustrations and Scripture, the book gently teaches children that God's words bring healing, light, and strength, even when emotions feel overwhelming. It's a powerful tool for helping kids understand how to guard their hearts and trust the One who makes them whole.


Brian's Jesus Film Mission Trip in Ghana



This summary is adapted from a reflection originally written by Brian.

y ten days in Ghana were deeply eye-opening, marked by warm welcomes, sobering realities, and unforgettable faith. From Tamale to villages like Yendi, Navrongo, and Chiana, we visited churches that my home church partnered with, hearing stories of persecution crops destroyed, families disowned, and believers banished to places like the "witch camp." Yet amid hardship, I witnessed profound joy and generosity, like the woman who said, "How could I not follow Christ when He has provided for all my needs?" Seeing churches unite to host a vibrant youth camp was inspiring, and most moving of all, 19 adults and many children made the decision to follow Jesus. Visiting Cape Coast Castle confronted me with the horrors of slavery and the urgent call for Christians to stand against such evil. I've come home with new friendships, lasting memories, and a renewed sense of conviction.
